Truckee River Rail Road Open for Business

The Society's TRUCKEE RIVER RAILROAD miniature train at the Community Regional Park is up and running!! The first run day was August 31 and we had 125 riders in three hours with no advertising. On September 14 we had a formal opening with our partner the Truckee Donner Recreation and Park district staff and board members. Our monetary and in-kind donors, and construction volunteers were all recognized and each in attendance installed a "golden screw" to complete the ceremony. We were overwhelmed with over 225 kids and parents riding the train with only a small announcement in our local community newspaper.

Our next run days will be Sunday September 28, Saturday October 11 and 25. We might schedule a run in November weather permitting. Watch the Society's webpage for updates on our run schedule.

Each run requires four volunteers: a Trainmaster, Stationmaster, Conductor, and Engineer (each position has documented responsibilities) with individuals rotating between the positions during the day. Ideally we will have a fifth person who can give the others a break during the day.

Phase 2 (in the survey and planning stage) will add an additional 800 feet of track. We are also planning to construct a scale snow shed to be both a feature during the ride and an on site storage facility. Other station and track amenity projects are envisioned.

We will also be working through the winter on engineer and caboose cars, construction of a static play train, and miscellaneous other projects in preparation for next summer. Thanks again to all our construction volunteers and donors for all the hard work and support. A special thanks to Tom Smith for the several hundred hours he has put into the project. We plan to have everyone recognized on a permanent plaque to be on display at the track next summer. Please contact me if you

want to get involved in the operations by helping out on our remaining run days this year or on the winter projects. And of course, additional funding for the projects this winter and next summer is always needed so please consider a donation to help us along with our plans. Keep the bells and whistles
